The humble Petition of John Awansamaug (Indian of Natick) sen.^r

Humbly sheweth

That wheras hee formerly sold his hereditary lands now within the bounds of Medfield Mendham & Sherbourn reserving only about one thousand Acres of Land in ye midst (lying bettween those English Townes) to himself: but he being now disposed to sell the same as it lies bounded by the Town of Dedham on the south side therof unto such as will amongst the sd Townes or other Englishmen as will buy the same, & hee understanding that now can without dispute buy & purchase the same, but by ordr of ye Genll Court to shew his ready submission to the Lawes of this Jurisdiction

Hee in most humble manner prayes y.t with the approbation & good liking of this hono.td Court hee may dispose of, sell & alienate the s.d Land in whole or in percells as hee liketh unto any or all of the s.d Townes, or to any other English person or persons also as hee thinks good.

And yo.r Petitione.r shall ever pray &c:.
