The humble Petition of us the Subscribers Indians of Nantucket humbly Sheweth, That we are under great Difficulty & Opprefsion by the English Inhabitants of the faid Nantucket, & have been so for a long time for about forty Years past they took away all our Horses & Cattle of all Sorts, & practiced the fame ever since, alledging we have no Right to keep any, & of latter Years have taken away our planting Lands, not suffering us to plant any in Peace, & We can have no Remedy, by reason that it is all done by the Proprietors in common, & the Justice & Jurors are all concerned, & no longer fince than October last while one of us was gone to Boston to complain of Wrong done to us in our Planting Land the English People got to making Fence to inclose a great Part of our Land, we therefore pray that all Con= -troversies between English & Indians relating to Real Eftates may be tryed in fome other County, or other
