The Committee appointed to take into Confideration the Petition of the Rev.^d Zechariah Mayhew, Minister of the Gospel and Missionary to the Indians on Martha's Vineyard, have attended that Service, and ask leave to report the following Resolves.

State of Massachusetts-Bay.

In the House of Representatives, June 10 1779.

Upon the Petition of the Rev.d Zechariah Mayhew of Chilmark in the Country of Dukes-County, praying to be discharged of a certain Tax laid assessed on him by the Assessors of Chilmark for the Year 1778; and also to be secured from any such Demands in suture so long as he shall retain his present Office of Missionary among the Indians, for the Reasons set forth in said Petition.

Refolved that the Prayer of the Petition be granted, and that the Afsefsors of Chilmark aforefaid, be, and they hereby are ordered and directed to difscharge the faid Rev.d Zechariah Mayhew from a Tax afsefsed on him in the Year 1778, for a certain Farm under his immediate care and cultivation, as mentioned in faid Petition. And it is further Refolved, that the faid Rev.d Zechariah Mayhew shall not be taxed for the same in suture, so long as he sustains the said Office of Missionary, and occupies the said Farm himself, unless it shall be otherwise ordered by the General Court.
