that the said Sarah was One of the Tribe of Natives resident
at a place Called Golden Hill in the Town of Stratford
that None of the Ancient Tribe of Indians formerly
resident at that place are remaining on the Lands
~~at that place~~ ^{there} and that the same is a Valuable Estate
which together with the Rents due thereon Ought to
be Appropriated to the Use of the proper Owners thereof

Whereupon the Memorialists humbly pray your
Honours to Appoint A Wise and Judicious Committee
to Examin and Ascertain to whom the Estate aforesaid
Justly belongs and to sell and Dispose of such Land
& Collect all Rents due for Improvement thereof and the
same divide ~~the Avails thereof~~ to and Among the
proper Owners and that such Committee be Authorized
to give good and Valid ~~Deed or Deed~~ Deed or Deeds to the
purchasers thereof and the Memorialists as in duty
bound Shall Ever pray Dated at New haven the 15th
day of Oct^r 1793
