

At a meeting of some of the authority on the eighteenth may of Novembr 1701, in order~ to Hear the. complaint of John Bates of Haddam againft an Indian man Called Wenemo~ for that the said. wenemo did on or about the: tenth. day of aprill seventeen hundred. & one fellonously take away out of the said John Bates: his dwelling houfe severall goods, viz a good fier lock gun, sum powder & shot, a paire of shoes, with other-things, the indian man viz wenemo owned the fact.

the authority that is to say Nath Stanly, Esq.^r Judge M^r John Haines & John Chester doe order that the said Indian man wenemo doe pay to John Bates, for what charges the said Bates hath been att, with what said Indian stole from him the sum of fower : ~ pounds ten shillings in mony: & alfo that he pay as a fine twenty shillings in mony to the Court Treafury, or be whipt severely on the naked body, & alfo to discharge the prifon keepers ffees, & for his bringing from ffarmington to prifon

Nannouch a ffarmington Indian appering in Hartford, this Eighteenth day of Novembr seiventeen hundred & one ^& becamel furety for the payment of the summs above mentioned, - Now Know all men by these presents that Nannoch aforesaid, for good Reasons him thereunto moveing & efpecially for suritifhip for the payment of the above said sum, Doth give grant Bargaine sell aliene make over & morgage, two acres of land scituate in farmingtowne meadow, neer to the corn mill of Cap^m Thomas hart lying in the indian neck, being bounded on land of Ens:ⁿ John hart in part, which said parcell or peice of Land the said, Nannouch Doft make over & confirme: to John Bates of Haddam in the county of Hartford, in the Collon of Connecticott, to him his Heirs Executors Adminiftrators or afsignes, which Land is ffree & cleer, & fufficiently faved from all gifts grants & bargaines whatsoever; & that the said John Bates shall pofsefs & inJoy the said two acres of Land with all its priviledges & apurtenances to the same belonging or in any wife appertaining whatsoever from the day of the Date hereof, always provided If the said Nanno[^]ch, shall well & truly pay to the said John Bates, the charges as above mentioned, with the fine to the county Treasury; & other charges as above mentioned, then this Alination or morgage to be of none. Effect, otherwise to be of full force virtue & strength to all intents and purpofes, which payment is to be on or before the next election Day, which will be in the year on thoufand seven hundred & two:
