

Know all persons by these presents that I Oweneca sachem  
of <sup>67a</sup>Mohegan in her Majesties Collony of Connecticut for Divers  
Considerations me thereunto moving and more Especially for  
the more Effectually severing A certain partt of the Land  
comonly called the Mohegan feilds Lying and being within  
the Bounds of the Towne of newLondon In the Collony aforesayed  
To my owne use and the use of my Heires and succelsars and  
such Mohegan Indians as I or they now have or may hereafter  
have Liveing with them In the saide feilds Acording to the true  
Intent and meaning of the Instruement made by the Honourable  
John Mason Esq<sup>r</sup> Deceased sequestering saide feilds to the affore  
saide use: have given granted enffeofed and confirmed unto  
the Honorable Gurdon Saltonstall Esq<sup>r</sup> of newLondon affore<sup>ed</sup>  
Cap<sup>t</sup> John Mafon of Stonington In the collony affore<sup>ed</sup> Grand  
son to the afore<sup>ed</sup> John Mason, Major John Levingston of  
newlondon afores<sup>d</sup> cap<sup>t</sup> Daniell ffitch, neer the South Bounds  
of norwich and Joseph Stanton of Stonington & their Heires  
ffor Ever all that part of the Mohegan feilds which Lyeth  
In newLondon afore<sup>ed</sup> and which is Bounded on the south by  
by the streight Line Runing from the Tree Comonly Called new  
London northweft corner Tree to A white Rock Lying in the  
Greate River which Runeth frome norwich to new Londo<sup>n</sup>  
in the Collony affore<sup>ed</sup> and on the Easte by the Gr<sup>e</sup>ate River  
on the North by A Coave Comonly Called Tradeing Coave and  
up along Tadeing Coave brooke untill it Comes to the Easte  
bounds of A parcell of Land which I sould to Major John -  
Levingston Leiu<sup>t</sup> Robertt Denison Samuell Rogers Junio<sup>r</sup> and  
James Harris Junio<sup>r</sup> which is two black oake trees ~~mark~~ &  
marked at the south side of stony brooke about one hundr<sup>d</sup>  
yards frome s<sup>d</sup> brooke and A wheate feilde on the north side  
of saide brooke: which feilde is now Improved by Cap<sup>t</sup> Thoma<sup>s</sup>  
Avery and frome the afore<sup>ed</sup> two trees and feilde Runs A Due  
South Line to the Line which Runs frome newLondon  
old northweft Corner tree to the White Rock in the Greate  
River<sup>82</sup>Which Runs frome norwich to newLondon & frome  
the afore<sup>ed</sup> Trees and feilde Runs A Due  
north Line

Gurdon Saltonstall Esq<sup>r</sup> John Mafon John Levingston Daniel Fitch and Joseph Stanton all the s<sup>d</sup> Land and Bargained premises In Equall parts and their Heires & Assignes for Ever Respectively: ~~To this~~ To this End and meaning & Intent Construction and purpose that they and their Heires for Ever Shall from henceforth Stand and be seized of the saide mentioned premises as above Expressed to the Use Intent and purpose hereafter in these presents Limited and Declared & to no other Use whatsoever: That is to Say to the Use and ~ behoofe of me the s<sup>d</sup> Oweneca my Heires and successours and all Such Mohegan Indians as I or they may at Anytime have Living with us in the s<sup>d</sup> Mohegan fields or with Either of us so that neither I my heires or Successors may at Any Time hereafter be able to Alienate or Dispose of the s<sup>d</sup> premises or Any partt or parcell of them: but that they be preferred and Keptt & for Ever secured to the Constant Use and Improvement of me my Heires and Successors and Indians afforefd for fire wood and Planting Reposing Speciall Trust in my aforementioned friends and their heires that they will Truly Effectually & Constantly Take Care that neither I my Heires or Successors or Indians before mentioned may be obstructed or hindred or Interrupted In our Improvement of and upon the s<sup>d</sup> Land as above expressed: Always provided and it is hereby to be Understood that cap<sup>t</sup> Daniel fitch now Dwelling within the aforesaide Mohegan fields be secured and Quieted in the Possession of three or ffoure hundred Acres of Land bounded as followeth Beginning at Trading Coave brooke where the ffresh water falls in to the salt and so Runing upwards by side of s<sup>d</sup> brooke three score Rods northwesterly of A greate swampe comenly Knowne by the name of weequeenuck & frome

And frome thenc Southerly to A place Called by the Natives Towequensuck and runing Easterly to the first mentioned <sup>-67c</sup> Bounds, and the Lands on the north side of the new London Bounds which is the Line frome the northwest Corner tree to the ~~white~~ white Rock in the River which Runs frome Norwich to New London which Joynes upon the afforefd Line on the south a and Runs forty Rods Due north all Along said Line & the neck of Land Which also Lyeth on the northward of saide Towne Line and the River on the East as it is now fenced and Improved by Jonathan Morgan by vertue of A Lease he hath frome Major John Levingston: The above Expressed Two parcells of Land are and Doe Remaine to the aforementioned cap<sup>t</sup> Daniel fitch and Major John Levingston and their heires and Assignes for Ever In Testimony ~ Whereof I the saide Oweneca with the free and volluntary Consent of my People have hereunto sett my hand and seale

the tenth Day of May in the ninth year of the Reigne of our  
soveraigne Lady Ann Queen of Greate Brittainne ffraunce  
and Ireland Deffender of the ffaith &c: and in the yeare of  
our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Tenn -----
