The Petition of Nathaniel Coochuck Indian Man of Natick in the County of Middlefex Humbly Shews That he is Informed this Hon<sup>ble</sup> Court have Granted Liberty to Extend two Executions on his Real Eftate the one at ve suit of Robt Rand & the other ^at ye suit of Jonathan Dewing: Wherfor he humbly prays the s<sup>d</sup> Executions may Not be Extended in his Homestead [at] He Having other Lands sufficient to pay his Debts & knowing it will be Very Chargeable to Extend y<sup>e</sup> Executions on his Eftate & Tend Very much to his Difadvantage (he having No Intent to defraud any of his Creditors but to pay them Honestly & that it may don with Leaft preju dice to your pet<sup>r</sup> He further humbly prays this hon<sup>ble</sup> Court would Enable him to sell sume of his Out Lands in Natick Aforf<sup>d</sup> for payment of y<sup>e</sup> two Execution<sup>s</sup> Afors<sup>d</sup> & some small debts (he Supposes Twenty Acres will be sufficient) & to país & Execute Good Deed or Deeds theirof to some of his Maj<sup>IS</sup> Englifh subjects and [ *illegible* ]the Executions aforesaid may be staid till ye sale & as in Duty bound shall pray &c Ianuary 13 1741 January 13. 1741 Nathaniel Coochuck
