by his Certain Deed of Bargain and Sale Dated the  
third Day of April 1718 <sup>for a valuable Consideration</sup> Sold and Conveyed unto Samuel Judd  
late of said Farmington Now Dece:<sup>d</sup> One Peice of land lying and  
being Scituate in the Township of Farmington within the  
Meadow or Common field at a Place Called the Indian Neck  
Containing two Acres One Rood and thirty <sup>five</sup> Rods of Land butted  
Notherly on John Lees Land Southerly part on s.<sup>d</sup> Judds Land and  
Part on Nath:<sup>ll</sup> Coles Land and a Lefser part of Joseph Roots Land—  
Welterly on s.<sup>d</sup> Roots Land Easterly on Land that was Thomfons and  
Whereas the said Land by the Laft Will and Testament of the s:<sup>d</sup> Samuel  
Judd Decended unto Sarah Judd Daughter and heire of the s:<sup>d</sup> Samuel  
and the s:<sup>d</sup> Sarah afterwards Marrying with Zebulon Woodruff  
of said Farmington – and Whereas the Said Zebulon and Sarah  
by their Certain Deed of Bargain & Sale for a Valuable Confidera:  
tion Sold and Conveyed the above Defcribed Parcle of Land unto –  
Daniel Curtis of said Farmington And Whereas James Wawawous  
an Indian Native of Farmington and One of the Tuncis Tribe  
of Indians living in said Farmington together ~~of~~ with the  
Reft of the <sup>s<sup>d</sup></sup> Tribe living in said Farmington have by their  
Petition Now lying in <sup>the</sup> Office of the General Afsembly of the  
Governor and Company of his Majesties English Colony of Connec:<sup>tt</sup>  
in New England by Continuance from the s.<sup>d</sup> Afsembly in their  
Sefsions in May laft therein Demanding of the said Curtis the  
Surrendery of s.<sup>d</sup> Defcribed Parcle of Land to them s.<sup>d</sup> Wawawous &c  
and Whereas the s.<sup>d</sup> Curtis has Cited s.<sup>d</sup> Woodruff <sup>& Wife</sup> to Defend him s.<sup>d</sup> Curtis  
in the Pofselsion of s.<sup>d</sup> Land ---- These are therefore to the  
Sheriff of Hartford County his Deputy or to Either of Farmington Confta:  
bles within said County Commanding you to Make Samuel Hooker  
Late Called and Known by the Name of Sam:<sup>ll</sup> Hooker Jun.<sup>r</sup> of said Far:  
mington to Know that he must (if he <sup>see</sup> Cause) appeare before the  
General Afsembly afores:<sup>d</sup> at their Sefsions to be Held at Newhaven  
within and for s.<sup>d</sup> Colony on the Second Thursday of October Inft. towit  
that he appeare before s:<sup>d</sup> Afsembly on the first Tuesday Next after said  
Thursday then and there to Defend and Make Good his Covenant in said  
Deed to s.<sup>d</sup> Samuel Judd againft s.<sup>d</sup> Wawawous &c (who Clame s.<sup>d</sup> Land  
by force of a More Ancient Title than the Deed afores:<sup>d</sup>) as he will  
avoyd the Confequences herein fail not but Due return Make Dated  
Farmington this 7<sup>th</sup> day of October AD 1768 and in the Eighth  
Yeare of his Majesties Reign
