

Whereas Jonathan Smith J:^r formerly of Farmington in the County of Hartford Now of Woodbury in the County of Litchfield by his Deed of Bargain [^] & Sale [^] ^{Containing a Covenant of Warranty} Dated the 10th may AD 1745 for a Valuable Consideration Sold and Conveyed unto Solomon Thomfon Then and Now of said Farmington a Certain Peice or Tract of Land Lying and being scituate in the Township of Farmington afores^d within the Common field and at a Place Called the Indian Neck Containing three Roods of Land Butted East on the River West and Part South on Land [^] ^{belonging to the Heirs} of Samuel Judd Dece:^d North Part on Land of Lief:^t Giles Hooker and Part on Land of Sam:^{ll} Cowles Dece:^d South on Land of William Wadsworth as by his s:^d Deed may More fully appeares referance thereunto being had – And Whereas James Wawawous One of the Tuncis Tribe of Indians liveing in s:^d Farmington together with the reft of said Tribe have by their Petition (Now Lying [^] in the Office of the General Afsembly of this Colony) Challenged of the said Thomfon the surrendery of the Peaceable & ~~Quiet~~ Quiet Possesfion of said Land as being Part of that Large Tract of Land Called the Indian Neck s:^d Tribe Challenging said Land by force of a Deed from the Inhabitants of the said Town of Farmington of Much More Ancient Date than the Said Deed form the Said Smith to the Said Thomfon,

These are therefore In his Majesties Name to Litchfield County Sheriff his Deputy or to Either of Woodbury Conftables within said County Greeting Commanding you to Make the said Jona:th Smith to Know that he must if he see Cause Appear before the General Afsembly of the Governer and Company of his Majesties English Colony of Connecticut to be held at Newhaven within said— Colony on the Second Thursday of Inf^t October (Viz) that He appeare before s:^d Afsembly on the first Tuesday of Next after said Thursday then and there to Defend the Said Thomfon in the Peaceable Possesfion the said Described Tract of Land from and against the Demands of the said James &:^c as he will Avoyd the Confequence herein fail not but Due return Make Dated at Farmington this 10th Day of October AD 1768 and In the Eighth Year of his Majesties Reign ~~~~~
