

Whereas this Afsembly at their Sefsion at  
 New Haven in Jan.<sup>y</sup> 1769, did by their Refolve  
 authorize & fully impower Adam an Indian  
 Native belonging to Farmington, under y<sup>e</sup> Direction  
 of Jos<sup>o</sup> Strong Esq of Farmington & Sam<sup>ll</sup> Bilhop Esq  
 of N. Haven, to make fale in comōn form of a  
 small Interest in Lands <sup>lying at East Haven</sup> belonging to Adam & the  
 reft of y<sup>e</sup> tribe lately dwelling at s<sup>d</sup> East Haven, & the  
 Moneys raifed by fuch fale ~~to~~ with y<sup>e</sup> Conftent of s<sup>d</sup>  
 Strong & Bilhop to lay out in y<sup>e</sup> purchafe of other  
 Lands for y<sup>e</sup> benefit of s<sup>d</sup> tribe.

& it being now represented to this Afsembly, that  
 the s<sup>d</sup> Adam (having not made fuch fale) is  
 very infirm & declining &c & not able to transact &  
 finish s<sup>d</sup> Buſinefs

It is therefore Refolved by this Afsembly That  
 Samuel Adam an Indian Native of s<sup>d</sup> Tribe, be  
 & He is hereby invested with the fame Powers &  
 Authority relating to s<sup>d</sup> Lands & the fale thereof  
 & the Difpofition of the Money ~~arifing~~ arifing  
 thereby & under the fame Regulations as was granted  
 & provided to afor s<sup>d</sup> Adam, by the Refolve of  
 this Afsembly as afores.<sup>d</sup>
