was Occafioned to the s^d Town of Northampton according to the particular Acconts herewith Exhibited the whole whereof has sometime since been disbursed and paid by the s^d Town of Northampton, the Subfcribers therefore humbly Subplicate your Excellency and Hon^{TS} that the Sum of the Aboves^d charge and expense May be defrayed out of the Publick Treasury of this Province by Warrant from Your Excellency and that the Same May be thereby Made Payable to M.^r Caleb Strong Jun^r Treasurer of the s^d Northampton to the s^d Towns use which is humbly Submitted by the Subfcribers who as in duty bound will Always pray
