The Petition of Submit Awonfamugg an Indian
 Woman, belonging to Grafton, Humbly Sheweth

That your Petitioner has been for this Eighteen Months
 past in a very low & languishing State of Health,
 and is now brought so weak, that she has not for this six
 Months past been able to walk one Mile, that your Petitioner
 is Indebted to several Physicians in Considerable
 Sums as by their Accounts Accompanying this Petition
 may appear. That your Petitioner is now, and has been for
 more than Six Weeks at the House of Ebenezer Hill of
 Holliston where she is Boarded and Nursed, and is wholly
 Destitute of any means wherewith to pay her Physicians,
 her Boarding, or Nurse Nursing, or to procure any of
 the Necessaries of Life.

Therefore your Poor distressed Indian Petitioner
 humbly and earnestly Prays that your Excellency &
 Honors would be Pleased to make such a Grant to your
 Petitioner that will be Sufficient to Support her while
 she remains Sick & unable to help herself, and to Pay
 Discharge the Accounts herewith Exhibited, and likewise
 allow her a Bible and Blanket, or otherwise relieve
 her as your Excellency & Honors shall think proper.
 and your Petitioner as in Duty Bound shall Ever Pray
