Indorsed on s^d Conveyances & Sign: by s^d Com^{ttee}; or any two of them
Shall be effectual in the law for passing ^ the sd Indians Title to s^d Lands to the purchasers
Saving always the Right of y^e Newhaven ^ Tribe of Indians to any of s^d
Lands ----- & Such deeds being acknowledged by y^e Grantors
& duly recorded may be given in evidence of Such titule in
any Court in this Colony -----
