

Upon the Memorial of Elijah Wimpey Solomon Mosuck Samuell Adams & the rest of the Tribe of Tunxis Indians living in farmington Showing to this asembly that upon the Invitation of <sup>^</sup> the Indians of the Six nations to Come up & dwell with them promifing them a Sufficiency of Lands for them &c the memorialifts propose to remove & pray that Col John Strong Fisher Gay Esq<sup>r</sup> & M<sup>r</sup> Elnathan Gridly all of Farmington may be appointed a Com.<sup>ttee</sup> to over See & direct them in the sale of their lands in this Colony &c as p<sup>r</sup> memorial on file

Resolved by this asembly that Col John Strong Fisher Gay Esq<sup>r</sup> And m<sup>r</sup> Elnathan Gridly all of farmington be & they are <sup>^</sup> hereby appointed a Committee to over see direct & inspect the memorialifts in the Sale of their lands – & all ~~Lands~~ Sales of lands made by the Memorialifts by & with the Consent & approbation of s<sup>d</sup> Com<sup>ttee</sup>; or any two of them Indorsed on s<sup>d</sup> Conveyances & Sign:<sup>d</sup> by s<sup>d</sup> Com<sup>ttee</sup>; or any two of them Shall be effectual in the law for pafsing <sup>^</sup> the s<sup>d</sup> Indians Title to s<sup>d</sup> Lands to the purchasers Saving always the Right of y<sup>e</sup> Newhaven <sup>^</sup> Tribe of Indians to any of s<sup>d</sup> Lands ----- & Such deeds being acknowledged by y<sup>e</sup> Grantors & duly recorded may be given in evidence of Such titule in any Court in this Colony -----
