Do give, grant, bargain, sell, and confirm unto the said *Palmer Sweet his  
Heirs and Assigns forever one Certain piece or parcel  
of Land in Farmington Afores.<sup>d</sup> at the Indian Grant  
So Called and is the 33<sup>d</sup> Lott in Number and Contains  
three Acres & three Quarters and 20 rods of Land Butted  
& Bounded as followeth (viz) South on Abigail Shillings  
North on Catherine Charles west on the Common  
Fence and East on Felix Sherman ...*

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, the above granted and bargained Premises, with the Appur-  
tenances thereof, unto *him* the said *Palmer Sweet*

*his* Heirs and Assigns

forever, to *his* and their own Proper Use and Behoof. And also, *I* the said  
*Andrew Corcump*

do for *my self my* Heirs, Executors and

Administrators, covenant with the said *Palmer Sweet his*

Heirs and Assigns; that at and until the enfealing of these Presents, *I am* well  
satisfied of the Premises, as a good indefeasible Estate in Fee-simple, and have good  
Right to bargain and sell the same, in Manner and Form as is above written, and that  
the same is free of all In- cumbrances whatsoever. AND FURTHERMORE,

*I* the said *Andrew Corcump*

do by these Presents, bind *my self my* Heirs, forever to Warrant  
and Defend the above granted and bargained Premises, to *him* the said *Palmer  
Sweet his*

Heirs and Assigns against all Claims and Demands whatsoever.
