To the Honourable the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts In General Court Assembled

The Petition of Lemuel Corbin John Healy and Mark Dodge all of Dudley in the County of Worcester Guardians to the Indians called the Dudley Indian and Levi Davis of Charlton in sd County Humbly Sheweth That there is near the Centre of the Town of Dudley two Hundred acres of land Chiefly under Improvement the rents of said land is to be applied for the Support of said Indians so long as any of Said Indians shall remain the fee of said land after the decease of said Indians is vested in the said Levi and as the fences on Said land is made of wood and very much decayed So as the rents thereof will not be likely to the amount to more that Thirty Pounds Per Year which Proves Infufficient for the necessary Support of said Indians as they have Already Accumelated a debt over and above the [ illegible ] to the amount of Upwards of one Hundred Pounds near three Hundred Dollars which the sd Guardians have no Affets in their hands to difcharge and on that account Your Petitioners therefore Pray Your Honours to Grant the Said Davis liberty to sell and Convey said lands under the following Conditions he difcharging the above mentioned debt due to the said Guardians and Alfo Secure to the said Indians a Certain tract of land on the Eafterly side of said Dudley not more than two miles from the land above mentioned which is well wooded so as to be Comfortable for said Indians for fier wood and to Erect their huts upon containing between Twenty and thirty acres and Alfo lodge in the Treafury of the Commonwealth the sum of five Hundred Pounds Lawful money or such other place as the General Court Shall order the Interest and Principal of which sum to be applied for the Support and maintenance of said Indians in Such a manner as the General Court from time to time shall Direct the Interest of which sum of five Hundred Pounds is will Exceed [ crossout ] the sum the said lands have heretofore rented for or proverbly will and keep the fences thereon in repair As Your Petitioners in duty bound do Pray Dudley May 22d 1797 Lemuel Corbin
