The Petition of James Wakous, & Philena Wakous, his Wife, James A Jacob Thomas & Damaris Thomas his Wife, of Brothertown, in the State of New York, & Ellen Adams of New Marlborough in the State of Massachusetts, which said Philena, Damaris & Ellen are the only Children, & Heirs of Solomon Adams, A an Indian late of Farmington in Hartford County, an Deceased, & Timothy Root of said Farmington, humbly sheweth that in the year AD 17 AD 1783 the said Solomon died, & his Ef leaving Eftate, both real & perfonal, that his Eftate was settled by the Court of Probate for the diftrict of Farming--ton agreeable in the same manner, as though the said Solomon had not been an Indian, other Estates of Deceased persons are settled & the Estate both real & perfonal subject to the incumbrance of the Widows Dower, was sold for payment of Debts, & that the said Timothy Root was the Grantee & has become the Assignee of the greatest part of said Real Estate That in the said James, Damaris A & Philena, Jacob & Damaris, & Ellen, have since sold & Releafed to the said Timo Root all their Right & Title to the real Eftate of said Solomen, lying in the first Society in sd Farmington, in & by their two Deeds of Quitclaim, by them executed A agreeable to law law & bearing date the 7th & 23d days of September & the 2d day of October AD 1801, for a confideration paid them by the said Root -- And, it being doubtful, whether said ^ real Eftate was settled agreeable could, agreeable to law, be sold by the Administrator on 196 said Eftate, & said Deeds will not be not valid
