The Petition of Hannah Chore, wife of John Chore of Natick -- Humbly Shews That Your Petitioner is the owner of about four & a half Acres of unimproved land Situate in said Natick, and that her Husband, was induced to give his Note for the Sum of fifty Dollars, for the bad conduct of one of his sons, and has been once confinded in Goal, and released by paying Costs, and must suffer the same again unlefs the said note is immediately paid, and haveing no other means to raise the money, she prays the Guardian of the Natick Indians, may be authorized to Sell the said land for the moft the same will fetch, and take up, said Note, paying the overplus over to your Petitioner, should there be any And as in duty bound will ever pray -her
