To the Honorable Senate, and Hon.d House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in General Court assembled The Petition of Moses Gimbee, of the Hafsanamisco tribe of Indians, humbly shews That the Trustee of the aforesaid tribe of Indians has the charge of property belonging to your petitioner, other than the original proprietary fund, so called, belonging to said Indians in that your petitioner is at present, destitute of either house or land and that he considers that it would be much for his comfort, and for the benefit of his family that a part of said property might be invested in such real estate, under the charge of the aforesaid Trustee, as will give a reasonable promise of meeting his expectations in this respect

Your petitioner therefore respectfully requests the Hon. General Court aforesaid, to authorize the Trustee of the Hassanamiscoe, as Grafton Indians to lay out a sum, not to exceed One Hundred Dollars, for real estate, for the benefit of your Petitioner, in some part of the Commonwealth, which shall appear most for his advantage

May 25th. 1824 Mofes Gimbee
