

Know all Men to whom these presents shall come that we Silas Chesebrough of North Stonington in New London County as principal, and Benjamin Pomeroy of said North Stonington as surety are holden and stand jointly & severally bound unto Isaac Spencer as Treasurer of the State of Connecticut, in the penal sum of two hundred dollars, to the payment of which, to the said Isaac Spencer or to his successor in said office, we bind ourselves our heirs, executors, and administrators, firmly by these presents signed with our hands & sealed with our seals at Norwich in New London County this 5th day of December AD 1827

The condition of the foregoing obligation is such that whereas the above bounden Silas Chesebrough is, by appointment of the County Court holden at Norwich in s^d New London County [^] November term AD 1827 the Overseer of that part of the Pequot tribe of Indians residing in s^d North Stonington, now if the said Silas shall faithfully account, according to law for the funds which are now, or may be hereafter in his hands, belonging to s^d tribe then said obligation is to be void, and in every other case to be in full force and virtue in the law
