To the Honourable Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled.

The petition of the undersigned proprietors of land on the Island of Chappequiddic in the County of Duke's County, respectfully represents, that the Division Line Fence on said Island, which separates the Indian Land from the Lands of the Proprietors, is much out of repair, and often broken down by the cattle of the coloured people, therby causing much disturbance; that the said proprietors, of whom there are thirty, have made and maintained said Division Line fence, which is Eight hundred rods long, for many years, and at a great Expense; - that said proprietors as a body are poor and unable to support said fence; Wherefore Your Petitioners pray that the burthen of supporting said Fence, may be removed from said propietors, and that the Com – monwealth will make and maintain said Fence. And, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
