Respectfully represents Sally Burr of
Boston in the County of Suffolk that she
is a Member of the Ponkapog tribe of
Indians – and that She has a Son James Burr
dependant upon her for Support – and that
She is unable to Maintain her'self and son
without assistance – wherefore she prays
that an annuity May be granted to her
of \$52 doll,, a year payable to the Guardian
of Said tribe and by him Expended for
the benefit of her'self and her said son
