To the Hon. Senate House of Representatives –

Respectfully represents Charlotte E. Myers of Boston in the County of Suffolk, widow, that she is a member of the Punkapog tribe of Indians, in feeble health and in indigent & destitute circumstances; that she has for several years received a grant from the State of Fifty two Dollars per annum, but that this sum, with the little pittance that she is able to earn by her own industry is ^ now wholly insufficient for her comfortable support or even to enable her to procure the bare necefsaries of life. Wherefore she prays that she may be allowed the sum of Two Dollars per week during the ensuing year or such other sum such as to your honorable bodies may deem fair and reasonable.
