To the Hon. Senate and House of Representatives of Massachusetts, in General Court assembled.

The undersigned, Guardian of the Indians and people of color resident at Cappequiddic and Christiantown in Dukes County, respectfully represents to your Hon. Body, that Asa Peters of the latter tribe, is now sick, and has been for the last four years, and unable to provide for two motherless children: That three orphan children under the age of eight years are dependent up^on the aid they may receive from the State, for their support. That the Legislative of 1868, allowed the Guardian the sum of \$200. (or so much thereof as should be necefsary,) as aid in the support of said Peters and two children, and the three orphans – all be – longing to the Christiantown tribe; and that the said Legislature also allowed the undersigned the sum of \$104 – for the support of the two schools. Resolve – Chap 32./68 Making in the aggregate the sum of \$304.

Wherefore your petitioner prays your Hon. body to allow him the said sum of \$304 for the purposes aforesaid; And as in duty bound will ever pray.
